river and I could see the car sink. Luckily, the army tank

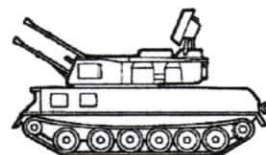
chased them and caught the thieves. Then the army tank stopped

and his eyes were red.

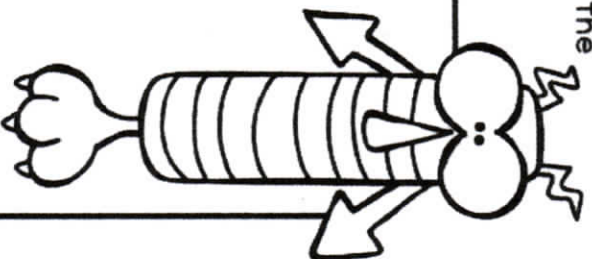
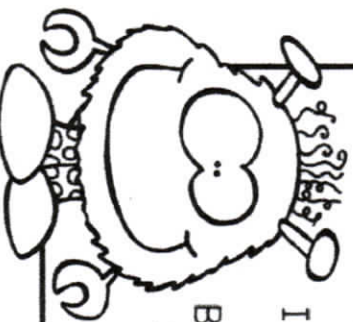
I thought I saw a monster
