Language focus

The future tense

We use the **future tense** to talk about what is going to happen.

The future tense is made up of two words.

The first word is often will.

I/We	will	wait	for the rain to stop.
You/They		wear	a sunhat.
He/She/It		be	cloudy today.

Sometimes you can use is/are going to instead of will.

Examples: It will rain this afternoon.

It is going to rain this afternoon.

Countable and uncountable nouns

Uncountable nouns do not use a or an.
You can use the or some with
uncountable nouns.
