Instead we are going to write an essay from theme 7, where your friend plays a trick on you and dares you to go into a so-called haunted house. First read all the instructions on the power point, then study the rubric in the planning file before you start writing.

Keep in mind that it is a descriptive essay, so you must use your senses.

Do not just use the sense of sight.

Write the essay on a separate folio/page, not in your classwork book.

The task: Your friend dared you to go into a so-called haunted house. Describe the house and your feelings. Use your senses (sight, hearing,

touch, smell). 100-120 words

Start with the planning:

Write Haunted House in your classwork book.

Then the 5 W's: What, where, when, who, why and also how.

Next to each word write only words, not full sentences

For example:

Who: I, my friend, Preston


Where: scary/deserted/ancient house in Swamp Street

What: the dare, entered house, very scared, ran out, escaped just in time.

When: at midnight or after school

Why: Preston dared me/ I wanted to be brave

How: jumped through window to escape OR Preston opened door, laughing







You need to know the whole story before you start writing, also the ending. Now write Haunted House + your name and surname on a folio. Paragraph 1 is your introduction. So you have to introduce the topic. Mention the house and the dare. Just write one or two sentences and get your reader's attention, so that he/she wants to read the rest. Place yourself right at the house, do not have a long introduction. Use your senses.

For example:

I stare at the deserted, gloomy house, as a chilly wind blows down Swamp Street. Why did I have to accept Preston's dare?

Here are some descriptive words that you may want to use: scary, squeaky, creak, frightening, fear, suspicious, thunder, lightning, deserted, terrified, noises, thought, caught, strange, struggled, follow, whisper, dusty, shadows, shriek, faint, midnight, owl, spider webs, mysterious, trembling



Paragraph 2 is the body of your essay. Here you describe what happens/happened. You can write in present or past tense, just do not mix your tenses.

Now write what you hear, see, smell or feel as you enter and walk about in the house. Write what happens and how you leave the house.

For example:

The door squeaks as I open it. It smells musty/ as if the house has been closed for many years. Spider webs cling to my face. I wipe them away quickly. What is that faint/strange sound coming from upstairs?



Paragraph 3 is your ending. The ending is short (1-2 sentences) and rounds off the essay or makes the reader wonder.

For example:

I can still hear Preston's laugh ringing in my ears! Will I accept another dare? Definitely not!

Count the number of words you used. It must be more or less 100-120 words. If you have 50 words, you need to add more descriptions to par.3. If you have 250 words, you need to erase


some descriptions from par.3.
