TO TEST IF A WORD IS A NOUN, YOU CAN USUALLY PUT THE  
ARTICLE A OR THE IN FRONT OF THE NOUN.





# COUNTABLE NOUNS

- ❖ We can **count** them
- ❖ You can put **a/an** in front of this noun
- ❖ It usually takes on **plural form**





# UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

- ❖ **Things/food** that we can **NOT** count
- ❖ CANNOT take on plural form
  - ❖ Usually **categories:**
    - Furniture, clothes, money
    - ❖ **Food/ drinks:**
      - Milk, juice, rice

Countable nouns are those nouns that we can count. We can put a/an in front of them and they usually take on plural form.

### UNCOUNTABLE NOUNS

Uncountable nouns are nouns that we cannot count. They include things, food and usually drinks. They cannot take on the plural form.
