What is summarizing?

When you take a longer piece of writing or speech and make it much shorter by mentioning only the important points



A good summary must:

just mention the main/most important details

not have many examples

be written in a clear, short sentence







Choose the answer that best summarizes the following paragraph.

- c) The dentist gave the writer medicine, to help when her tooth was pulled.








Summaries can be based on fiction (stories) or non-fiction (facts) passages.

When summarizing stories, you can use "the hand method".

Write the 5 W's (who, when, where, what, why on each finger and how in the palm)





- 1. Write who was in the story in five words.
- 2. Write what happened in ten to fifteen words.
- 3. Write when it happened in five words.
- 4. Write where it happened in five words.
- 5. Write why it happened in five words.
- 6. Write how it happened in five words.

Then you can write the steps in full sentences, taking note of the word limit. If you have more words than the limit, then you need to leave out some unnecessary details.



We are going to read the story of The Dove and the Ant on the next slide. It is also on the worksheet. Then you are going to summarise it, using the hand method. You need to write only the six steps (who, what, when, where, why and how) with the details of the story next to each step.

Write Summary: The Dove and the Ant as your heading in your classwork book and then do the six steps.



The Dove and the Ant
