**Adverb of time (when?)**

I have never travelled to space.  
Yesterday I watched a programme on planets.

**Adverb of place (where?)**

There are stars everywhere in space.  
There is gas inside the planet.

**Adverb of degree (how much?)**

The study of planets is extremely fascinating.  
The other planets are quite far from earth.

### **Revision Complex sentences p.66 no 1** **Memorandum**

- 1a) I'm going to keep practicing, so that I **become** good at it.
- b) David learnt how to juggle, while he **was singing** a song. / while he **was** in Grade 5.
- c) I collected the balls, which **were lying** on the ground.

#### **Take note:**

Do not just write singing or lying on its own – it is not a finite (full) verb.

You do not say. "She singing a song." You need to say, "She was singing a song."

### **Instructions: Juggling for beginners p.62** **Memorandum**

- 2a) A + B Good ball skills will definitely improve your chances of being successful. You also need to be determined or else you will give up too soon, as juggling is not easy.
  - b) It would be easier to start with one ball, than three.
