Tennis – watch Russia play France. Cricket – the Lions play the Cobras in Johannesburg. Soccer – watch Banyana Banyana play Cameroon.





This sentence is the most important sentence in the paragraph. It gives you the main idea of the paragraph. It is called the **topic sentence**.

In this soapie, Jules has a fight with Lucky. Lucky walks out. Jules starts to worry. Will she come back again?

This is the first episode of a sitcom series. **Three children decide to clean up the neighbourhood.** But the neighbours are not always happy about this.

The topic sentence often comes at the beginning of a paragraph. The other sentences in the paragraph tell you more about the main idea.

Sometimes the topic sentence does not come at the beginning of the paragraph.



The future tense

We use the (**simple**) **future tense** to talk about things that are going to happen, but have not happened yet. We can use the word **will** with the future tense. The verb remain in its basic form (infinitive) such as watch.

I, We, You, He, She, It, They	will	watch	television tonight.
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We can also write the future tense like this:

I	am going to	watch	television tonight.
We, You, They	are going to

The **Simple Future tense** is used when we plan or make a decision to do something. Nothing is said about the time in the future.



Positive Statements




1. **Plan:** What outing will you write about?
