- 4. circum- means around: circumference (the outer line or boarder of a circle); circumnavigate (go/navigate around the world) circumscribe (draw a figure around another figure)
- 5. transport -to carry goods/people from one place to another (trans means across)
 - export to send goods out of a country
 - import to bring goods into a country
 - deport to send or force a person out of the country
