Three minutes reading and then reporting.

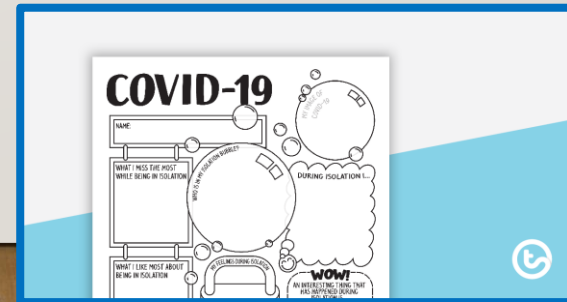
Mark the exercises done in week 5 – see file: Week 5 Memos.

Take note: Challenge 1a) Vesuvius erupted in AD 79. AD is Latin and stands for Anno Domini, which means “in the year of the Lord”. It refers to the birth of Jesus Christ.

So AD 79 is 79 years after the birth of Jesus. You can also refer to years before the birth of Jesus, then you say 10 BC. BC stands for “before Christ”.
