Active and Passive Voice Revision

Writing from Active to Passive Voice (The formula)

The frog catches the dragonfly.

*Find the object (who or what receives the action – verb + what/who)
= the dragonfly (singular)
*Tense of sentence = present tense
*Auxilian work + column 2 - ic (singular) + cought

- *Auxiliary verb + column 3 = is (singular) + caught
- *By somebody or something

The dragonfly is caught by the frog.

The tense of the sentence does not change, only the form of the verb.

Active Voice	Passive Voice
We write a test every week.	Every week a test is written by us.
We <u>are writing</u> a test.	A test is being written by us.
We <u>have written</u> a test.	A test has been written by us.
We <u>wrote</u> a test.	A test <u>was written</u> by us.
We <u>wrote</u> many tests.	Many tests were written by us.
We <u>can write</u> a test today.	A test can be written by us today.
We shall write a test.	A test <u>will be written</u> by us.
